I stole Jerry from a trivia session in the library to have our interview, but while I may have been driving his wheelchair to the lounge for our talk, as soon as we got there, he quietly folded his hands across his lap and asked “what would you like to know?” With his slight grin and piercing gaze, I suddenly felt like I was the one being interviewed.

The subtle intelligence of Jerry commands attention, and as he began to talk, it was what he left under-stated and implied, that added true color to his life story.

“I was born in Bloomington Illinois,” he began, “the middle child of three. But I grew up in a smaller town near Bloomington. It was good, had all of the smaller town attributes.” He paused to reminisce, lost in his thoughts, and then continued.

“I was a little studious, little adventurous as a boy. Though now that I think of it, more studious than in between.” Jerry skirted away from athletics in favor of playing musical instruments, and particularly enjoyed the trumpet. Upon getting to the high school portion of his life, he said “My daughter discovered it, I had forgotten about it, but I was the student body president-” He grinned crookedly and admitted, “-though, it was a pretty small school” he ended with a shrug.

Jerry went on to Purdue to pursue a career as a pharmacist, but put it on hold upon graduating and joined the US Air Force. He was a bomber pilot, “F-104’s were the plane, I think, and I flew as wingman to the squadron commander on quite a few bombing runs in Vietnam”. His eyes grew heavy as he continued, “I got so tired of dropping napalm on areas without knowing quite who I was dropping it on. And everything was visual back then (no radar guidance on weapons), so we had to drop down from the clouds into anti-aircraft fire to drop our bombs.”

After his service, Jerry scoured the country to find the right place to settle down. He decided on San Diego. “You made a good choice!” I said. He smiled wistfully and responded, “Yes, the weather.”

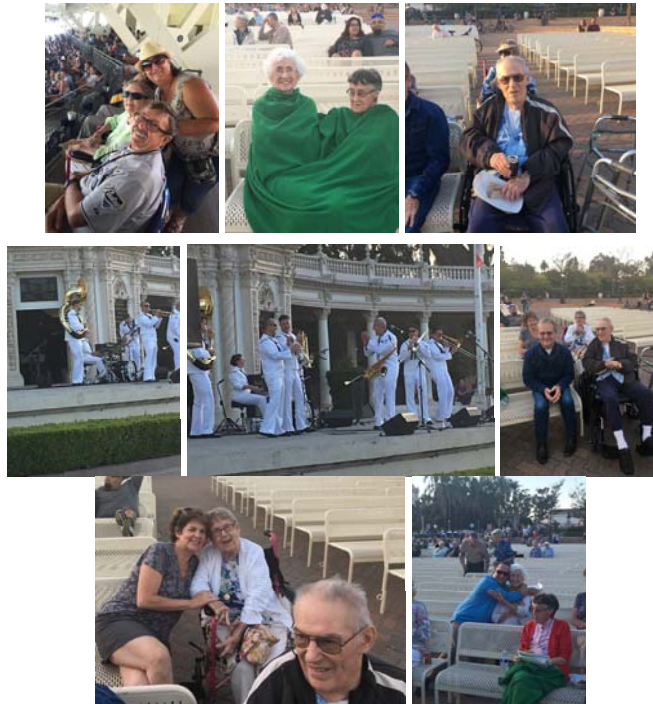

Once in San Diego, Jerry started working at the VA hospital as a pharmacist, met his wife Barbara Ann on a blind date, and raised two children. He continued working for the VA as head of smaller pharmacy clinics, and in his free time, "I was kind of into a little bit of everything. Particularly horses and dogs, I trained other people's animals as a hobby. Just learned how to train them as I went along."

He "retired" from the VA several times, but would always grow bored and return. "They would always hire me back" he said "but my final retirement was at 68, because people would keep stopping me in the hall asking me when I was going to quit".

He spoke slowly in his storytelling, considering his words and making them count. There was more to each story he told, but he coyly (or perhaps modestly) breezed over the specifics of his life accomplishments. Time seemed to stretch with the story of his life that could only be imagined between the lines. And just like that, our time was up. With a final pause and a thought, Jerry chuckled and smiled at me "That pretty well covers it".

I took him back to the library where they were still playing Trivia, and the moment he crossed the threshold he was belting off answers to the questions. As I parked his seat and moved to leave, Jerry raised his hand towards me the barest of inches, gave an almost imperceptible nod and a wink, before focusing back on the game at hand. That pretty well covered it indeed.
