We hope you are having a wonderful spring season. As we enjoy the sunshine and the warm spring air, we are also getting ready to do a rain dance to bring a few sprinkles into our little corner of the earth. So if we DO get a few droplets of rain... you're very welcome

While we usher in the new season, we do have a few spring housekeeping notes that we'd like to share with you.

The code to the stairwells and the elevator has been changed, as many of you have found out. Please refrain from sharing the codes with others (by loudly saying what it is across the room or as you're entering it) and if someone is with you, please block the view with your body or your hand as you enter the code. Resident safety is our primary concern and we'd like to ask you to use the elevator instead of the stairs when escorting your loved one to and from the garage. If you don't like waiting for the elevator, we can escort your loved one through the front lobby as you pull your car to the front of the building.

Speaking of the front of the building; (bear with me as I begin to sound like the recording at the airport) the green zone is for loading and unloading of passengers (or 30 minutes of parking) only and the red zone is NOT for parking, even for a few minutes. While we always want to welcome visitors, some of our residents have had difficulty when their seating is rearranged to accommodate visitors. Because we always want to put the needs of the residents first, we would like to ask that families and friends visit in the courtyard during dining hours if you want to bring something to share with your loved one. We are happy to set the table up for you if you'll call several hours in advance. (We have had some weekends with over 12 visitors in the dining room). Thank you for understanding that caring for your loved one is our first and most important priority.

As our residents are enjoying the Carlsbad Flower Fields, trips to Seaport Village and the Chula Vista Nature Center, won't you consider joining them on some of the outings? Please call Rachel and meet her and the residents at the next fun trip around town
